Glasgow School of Art students scoop up at Student Enterprise Awards

Product Design Engineering students at The Glasgow School of Arts have won a host of accolades at the Student Enterprise Awards, with one completing a treble win!

The annual awards recognise the cream of enterprising talent in Scotland's higher education institutes – and final year product design engineering student Samuel Smith led the way with a hat-trick of awards.

Samuel and Andrew Morrison, who is also in the final year of the product design engineering course, won the Product Based Business of the Year with their Vac-U-Loc bike carrier that is easy to use, flexible and secure.

Vac-U-Loc also went on to secure the overall New Ideas Competition which saw the pair pick up a cheque for £1,500 cash prize to help set up in business.

Samuel, completed his treble with the Scottish Institute for Enterprise's first ever Intern of the Year Award for his enthusiasm, professionalism and cross-institutional work.

Ian Guy, a final year student on the product design engineering course, won the Science, Technology and Engineering Award with his idea Air Free, a device to prevent air entrainment or embolisms in intravenous drips.

The students work will be on show as part of The Glasgow School of Art Degree Show 2010 which is free to the public and runs from 12-19th June 2010.
